CROYDON'S Michelle Gaudion has never experienced violence in the home but she knows it can happen to anyone. That's why she's hosting a high tea this month to raise money for McAuley Community Services for Women in Kensington,

which helps women and children in need.

Ms Gaudion said since becoming a parent seven months ago, she realised how important it was to look after one another, no matter what the circumstances were.

"It's hard enough being a

first-time parent, let alone not having a supportive partner and it horrifies me to think what that would be like," Ms Gaudion said.

Ms Gaudion is hoping to raise \$500 from her high tea at Blackburn Lake, with the service calling on others to

also host an event during May and June.
